

• The tuition fee and transport charges are for one academic year. For the convenience of parents, the payments may be made in **four equal instalments on or before respective due dates.**

• Due dates for instalments:

1st Instalment 10th April 2024 (At the time of admission for New Students) 2nd Instalment 10th July 2024 3rd Instalment 10th Oct 2024 4th Instalment 10th Jan 2025

- Security deposit is refundable without interest on withdrawal. Original receipt to be submitted with the claim for refund of Security Deposit. The amount will be forfeited if security deposit is not collected within a year of student's withdrawal.
- Only regular government employees posted in Chhattisgarh can avail the government concession. Individuals on probation and under contract are ineligible to access this benefit.
- For the wards of Regular Government Employees posted in Chhattisgarh, 50% of the Admission Fee and Security Deposit will be waived off. This Govt. Emp. Concession will be adjusted with the 4th Instalment of Tuition Fee. Concession will not be approved if the relevant documents are not submitted within 15 days of joining the school.
- If more than one child of a parent is studying in an academic session, 4th Instalment of Tuition Fee of the second (the eldest) child will be waived off. This Sibling Concession will be approved only if the due fees of all children are paid on or before the due dates.
- A parent can avail only one concession out of the two (Govt. Emp. & Sibling) in an academic session.
- Fee does not include the cost of books / notebooks and stationery.
- Fee shall be payable online (through School ERP) or through Cheque / DD in favour of **Delhi Public School, Raipur**
- Fees will be considered paid only after realization of the cheque. If a cheque is dishonoured by the bank, the school shall have right to initiate appropriate legal proceedings. Further, a Cheque Return Charge of 200/- (Rupees Two Hundred Only) will be applicable.
- Fee deposition is the responsibility of the parents. No reminder is given for deposition of fee.
- If an instalment is not paid on or before due date, a Late Fee penalty of ₹ 10 (Rupees Ten Only) per day shall be levied.
- If an instalment along with the Late Fee remains unpaid by the end of the following month of due date, the student's name will be struck off from the school rolls.
- All outstanding dues must be paid before the commencement of examinations failing which the student will not be allowed to appear in the examinations.
- Transport charges should be deposited before the lapse of each quarter, failing which the facility will be withdrawn.
- Transfer certificate / progress report will be released only after clearance of all dues.

ANTI-BULLYING POLICY

We believe that all students have the right to be educated in an environment where there is mutual respect and cooperation. Bullying is contrary to this approach and we do everything possible to discourage it.

Bullying is when someone deliberately goes out of their way to threaten, frighten, abuse or hurt someone else. It is also taunting or calling names as well as damaging a person's property, clothing or school work. It is ganging up on someone and isolating them.

School is committed to oppose bullying. Any form of the behaviour outlined below should never be ignored but challenged and the appropriate action taken.

Every pupil has the right to feel safe, secure, happy and free from intimidation.

Bullying can be defined as:

- malicious gossip
- · verbal threats and abuse
- intimidating behaviour causing fear, concern or isolation
- aggressive physical contact
- interference with personal belongings
- sexual, racial, social or disability harassment
- exclusion of the victim from group membership
- written comments including those posted on social networking sites
- graffiti in the school washroom, corridors and classrooms

It can be defined as bullying if physically or emotionally harmful actions are repetitive, wilful or persistent and are intentionally harmful and are carried out by an individual or a group; if there is an imbalance of power leaving the person who is bullied feeling defenceless.

Bullying is strictly prohibited inside the school premises and no such act will go unnoticed or unpunished.

Acts of bullying will be referred to the Discipline Committee, which after thorough investigation will recommend appropriate measures to be taken as per the guidelines laid down by CBSE.

You don't have to face this on your own.

GUIDELINES TO PARENTS

It is mandatory to observe and follow the rules & guidelines.

General Instructions

- 1. Students must carry Almanac to school every day.
- 2. Read school circulars on the website (www.dpsnavaraipur.in)/Almanac/Email/SMS.
- 3. Regular interaction with the teacher will help to address concerns and monitor progress.
- 4. Any change in address, contact no. or email id must be intimated in writing to school office or Headmistress at the earliest.
- 5. Encourage your ward to speak in English at home.
- 6. Parents / guardian must produce identity proof at the gate.

Hygiene and Turnout

- 1. Students must attend school in neat, well ironed and complete uniform.
- 2. Boys must maintain short and proper haircut.
- 3. Girls having long hair must tie their hair into two plaits. Those having short hair must wear a hairband.
- 4. Valuable articles like gold / diamond jewellery (chains, danglers, finger rings, earrings, nose ring, bangles), facial make up like eye makeup, lipstick & bindi, henna/ tattoo decorating on arms & feet, the colouring of hair is strictly prohibited. *If found, the articles will be confiscated for six months.*
- 5. Only girls are allowed to wear one pair of ear studs (only in ear lobes).
- 6. Application of Henna should be restricted to the inner side of the palm and that too with prior permission.

Code of Conduct for Students

- 1. Late comers will not be allowed inside the campus.
- 2. Students will be responsible for their belongings.
- 3. Shouting, whistling, running in corridors, throwing things out of the window are not allowed.
- 4. The school will not be responsible for any unlawful/criminal activity engaged in by the student.
- 5. Students will be expelled from the school by the recommendation of the disciplinary committee on the following grounds, which will be final and binding on the students:
 - a. Mental, moral, emotional and physical harassment of other students and the school staff.
 - b. Any misbehaviour /indiscipline by any student / parent and damage to school property.
 - c. Delay / Repetitive failure in payment of fee.
 - d. Unsatisfactory progress in academics.
 - e. Non-adherence to school rules, regulations and guidelines.
 - f. Possession of prohibited items.
 - g. Using any social networking site to comment negatively about students and the staff.

Birthday Celebration in School

- 1. Celebration should be through **distribution of toffees only.**
- 2. Cakes, pastries, cold drinks, chocolate bars, chewing gum and fancy gifts are not permitted for the peers and the staff.
- 3. Partying in the classroom or canteen is strictly prohibited.
- 4. School doesn't take any responsibility for any party/celebration organized by parents/students to celebrate birthdays outside the school campus.
- 5. Students of classes VI-VIII must wear school uniform on their birthdays.

Articles Prohibited in the School

- 1. Sharp objects, namely blades, knives, scissors, nail cutters and needles.
- 2. Firearms, Explosives, Crackers, Holi Colours.
- 3. The use of polythene bags and non-vegetarian food.
- 4. Alcohol, cigarette, E-Cigarette, tobacco products, pan masala or any other intoxicating / illegal substance.

Electronic gadgets (mobiles, i-pod, play-stations, audio / video players, cameras, smart watches, fitness trackers, recording devices), gold jewellery, toys etc. and expensive stationery articles. *If found, the articles will be confiscated for six months.*

Library

- 1. A Fine of ₹10/- per day will be imposed for not returning the library book.
- 2. In case of loss or damage to the book, the cost of the book at the present rate will be levied.

School Trips and Tours

- 1. The school provides Sleeper Class train fares for Zonal level (CBSE, SAI, SGFI & Inter DPS) participation and Three Tier A.C. train fares for national level participation.
- 2. The outstation lodging and food arrangements are provided by the host school as per DPS Society / CBSE norms.
- 3. Parents, guardians or representatives are not allowed to travel with DPSNR students or interfere in any inter-school event.
- 4. Students must stay with the escort teachers and teammates during any inter-school event.
- 5. Students will be allowed for school trips and tours only with the prior consent of their parents.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT

Disciplinary Measures

The school may adopt the following disciplinary measures in dealing with students behaving in an unruly manner and/or breaching the school disciplinary code/rules.

- 1. Oral warning and counselling
- 2. Written warning
- 3. Extra academic work, supervised by teachers, after school hours
- 4. Parent counselling within 24 hours with warning to the offender.
- 5. Suspension (ranging from 7 days to 30 days)
- 6. Expulsion from school

Students indulging in aggressive or violent behaviour will not be permitted to travel by school bus.

MEDICAL GUIDANCE

Parents are requested to impart health education to their children to enable the following:

- 1. Maintain personal hygiene.
- 2. Eat a balanced diet.
- 3. Drink clean water.
- 4. Follow a regular exercise / yoga schedule.
- 5. Have adequate sleep of at least 8 hours.

Parents are expected

- 1. To immunize their children as per the doctor's advice.
- 2. Not to send children suffering from conjunctivitis, skin disease, chicken pox, measles, influenza, mumps etc., to school till the prescribed period of abstinence is over.
- 3. To produce a doctor's certificate permitting the child to attend school when a student returns after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease.
- 4. To inform the school authorities in writing if the child is suffering from a chronic disease stating the history of illness and special precautions to be taken, if any.

Do note that:

- 1. The school has a well-equipped medical room and two qualified attendants to provide **first-aid** to a child in case of need.
- 2. In emergencies, the injured child is rushed to the hospital.
- 3. The school bears all expenses for the medical treatment given as first-aid. However, for extended treatment, the parents will bear the consultancy charges.
- 4. A medical card to record the health status and growth status of the child is maintained and a report there of is sent to the parents for information and necessary action.
- 5. The medical history of the child has to be filled up by the parents.





SCHOOL TRANSPORT

The transport facility provided by Delhi Public School, Nava Raipur, will cover the majority of areas within Raipur, but it will **not** be **obligatory** on the part of the school authorities to make **new routes**, extend routes or create **additional stops**. **Allotment of a seat is subject to availability**.

General Instructions:

- 1. Students must only board the bus at their designated stop and travel by the route allotted to them.
- 2. Change of address does not entitle the child to use a different school vehicle without permission from the school authorities. Any change in address will require new address proof, along with an application.
- 3. Students must be escorted to and from the bus stop.
- 4. Eating on the bus or littering is prohibited.
- 5. Throwing things out of the bus window is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Behaviour on the bus should be courteous.
- 7. Any damage to buses caused by negligence or vandalism will be fined.
- 8. Boys are allotted seats in the front and girls at the back, along with teachers. The teacher may change a student's seat if required.
- 9. Bullying in any form is a serious offence and will invite severe repercussions to the extent of withdrawal from the bus facility and expulsion from school.
- 10. For Safety reasons:
 - a. Students should stand away from the main road.
 - b. No body part should be outside the window.
 - c. No student should stand or move around inside the bus while the bus is in motion.
 - d. The driver's attention should not be distracted for any reason.
 - e. Student should not come near the door until the bus stops.
 - f. Student should not move to the driver's seat.
- 11. Forcing the school bus to stop between allocated stops, bribing conductors / drivers, misbehaving with school staff, entering the school bus to interact with students / staff is considered misconduct. It will result in the immediate withdrawal of the transport facility.
- 12. Transport charges should be deposited before lapse of each quarter, failing which the facility will be withdrawn.
- 13. Parents should keep the mobile number of his / her ward private from driver / conductor.
- 14. If any road / route is blocked temporarily / permanently by the government, the parents / students have to cooperate / abide by it.
- 15. More than one complaint of indiscipline in the bus will result in **withholding** / **withdrawing** the **transport facility** for a minimum of one week or permanently.

- 16. Students are only allowed to ride bikes as per the traffic department rules. The safety and security of the child in such cases is the sole responsibility of the parents.
- 17. Every child who leaves the school before the usual dispersal time / not use school transport needs to get a Gate Pass issued to leave the campus. Gate pass must be handed over to the security guard before leaving the school.
- 18. Children availing of personal transport must get the Permanent Gate Pass issued from the school reception.
- 19. Private vehicles are not allowed to enter the school campus for safety reasons except for sickness. Vehicle speed should not exceed 10 km/hr inside the campus.

SCHOOL HOUSES

The students of the school are divided into four Houses, each House headed by a House In charge and a team of teachers and House Prefects. The four Houses are:

1. Prabal House (House colour – Red)

Motto: United we stand, divided we fall.

2. Pragati House (House colour – Green)

Motto: Tough times never last, tough people do.

3. Pratap House (House colour – Blue)

Motto: Winners never quit and quitters never win.

4. Pragyan House (House colour – Yellow)

Motto: Perseverance leads to success.

House competitions and activities form a regular routine at school. Participation is encouraged through various inter-house competitions in creative and performing arts, literary activities, academic as well as sports and special assemblies, thereby, developing confidence in the members of the House to showcase their talents and abilities. Healthy competition and team spirit are thus inculcated and encouraged in every child. Houses are allotted to students from class I.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- 1. Students must wear the complete prescribed school uniform along with the identity card.
- 2. Sikh boys of pre-primary classes should wear a maroon turban with the winter and summer uniform.
- 3. For Sikh boys of classes I to VIII, the colour of the turban is green.
- 4. Bottle Green ribbons/bands/ hair clips to be used by girls. Pre-Primary girls will use maroon hair accessories.
- 5. Girls of Nursery to class II must wear bloomers under the tunic. Girls of class III upwards must wear black cycling shorts under the divided skirt.
- 6. Primary students must carry one clean white handkerchief daily. They must deposit a table mat & yoga mat with the class teacher.
- 7. For Pre-Primary students, two sets of aprons, table mats and napkins need to be purchased and deposited with the class teacher. They should bear the child's name or have an identification mark that the child can recognize. It will be sent home every Saturday to be washed and brought back on Monday.
- 8. Class V VIII boys should wear trousers.
- 9. Girls must wear knee-length skirts, and boys must wear trousers from the waist, not below it.
- 10. Medically beneficial shoes of Adidas/ Puma that are specifically designed to support or accommodate the mechanics and structure of the foot, ankle and leg are recommended.
- 11. Watches can only be worn from class VI onwards. Fancy and expensive watches are not allowed.

Students will only be allowed to enter the school premises if they turn up in the prescribed uniform.

WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES

- 1. Parents who wish to withdraw their ward in the mid of the session 2024-25 need to pay the fee up to the month last attended.
- 2. Transfer Certificate/ School Leaving Certificate will be issued after all the dues are cleared and the clearance form is completed.
- 3. For the withdrawal of transport services, one-month prior written notice is essential.
- 4. If a student does not join school after taking admission, the admission fee will be forfeited. Tuition Fee and Security Deposit, if deposited, will be returned without any interest.
- 5. Refund, if any, may be claimed within a year only of leaving the school.

ATTENDANCE

Coming regularly to school is an integral part of student's life. This inculcates discipline and regularity in a student. Students will not be allowed to enter the class without an absence note in Almanac if they have been absent on the previous day.

Leave of Absence:

- 1. Parents should submit an application through the Almanac.
- 2. **75% attendance is mandatory** to enable students to appear for the Final Assessment.
- 3. Students who have been **sick** for **three or more days** will bring a **medical certificate** from their doctor upon re-joining the school.
- 4. If a child is continuously absent from the school without prior information for seven days, then his / her name will be struck off from the attendance register.
- 5. All students will attend school on the reopening day after each vacation. Those absent for any illness must present a medical certificate before they are admitted to the class.
- 6. Leave on Assessment days should be strictly avoided as it may hamper the child's Academic Progress and Promotion to the higher class.
- 7. A certificate of appreciation is given to students with 100% attendance.

SCHOOL OUTINGS

- 1. Outings for Pre-Primary Classes are organized regularly, keeping in mind the relevant topics being covered in the class.
- 2. Educational trips for classes I and above are organised from time to time to help them get first-hand information for their project work.

SCHOOL PUBLICATIONS

A Newsletter *ROOTS* is published quarterly, highlighting the happenings at school and the students' achievements and creative efforts.

A collection of literary works of the students in the form of School Magazine *WINGS* is released. It reflects the events and achievements of students during the year and carries other articles / photographs of interest.

SCHOOL HONOURS AND AWARDS

In acknowledgment of outstanding achievements and contributions, we take pride in recognizing and celebrating the accomplishments of our students through a range of honours, awards, and certificates.

Based on students' outstanding academic performance and extraordinary achievements in co-curricular activities, along with teachers' observations and regular interactions, the 'School Award Committee' recommends for grant of awards.

ACADEMICS

- Scholar Badge: A Scholar Badge shall be awarded to a student for achieving academic excellence with a minimum 80% marks in all subjects in classes VI -VIII and a minimum 90% attendance. No exemption/relaxation in attendance is considered under any circumstances.
- **Scholar Blazer:** A student who earns the Scholar Badge for three consecutive years shall be awarded Scholar Blazer in the third year.
- **Scholar Tie:** A student who earns the Scholar Badge for four consecutive years shall be awarded Scholar Tie in the fourth year.
- **Piped Blazer:** A student who earns the Scholar Badge for five consecutive years shall be awarded Piped Blazer in the fifth year.
- Citation: Awarded for receiving Scholar Badge for six consecutive years.

ATTENDANCE

- 100% Attendance Certificate: Awarded to the students from classes Nursery to VIII for securing 100% attendance.
- **Award of Recognition:** Awarded for receiving 100% Attendance Certificate for 3 or more consecutive years.
- **Citation**: Awarded for receiving 100 % Attendance Certificate for 5 years.

Note:

- (i) A day's attendance is counted only if the student attends all the classes conducted during the day.
- (ii) Attendance is awarded to the students participating in competitions conducted by DPS Society, SAI, CBSE, Khelo India and SGFI only.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Excellence Award

- 1. Awarded for remarkable accomplishments in Art & Craft, Sports, Music (Vocal), Music (Instrumental), Dance, External Exams (Written & Oral), Robotics, Science & Innovation, Quiz, and Literary activities after the evaluation of the School Award Committee.
- 2. Achievements honoured by non-affiliated organizations without federation ties are not eligible for the Excellence Award.

Co-scholastic Blazer

- 1. Awarded to First three positions or any other equivalent positions and titles approved by the School Awards Committee in National or International level competitions.
- 2. Awarded to First three position holders in National level of External Examinations.
- 3. Awarded to top ten Final International position holders in External Examinations.

Co-Scholastic Tie

- 1. Awarded to the First three positions or any other equivalent positions and titles approved by the School Awards Committee in the National or International level competitions for two consecutive years and who have already received a Co-scholastic Blazer the previous year.
- 2. Awarded on achieving First three positions in National level of External Examinations for two consecutive years and who have already received Co-scholastic Blazer the previous year.
- 3. Awarded on achieving top ten Final International positions in External Examinations for two consecutive years and who have already received Co-scholastic Blazer the previous year.

Piped Co-scholastic Blazer

- 1. Awarded to the First three positions or any other equivalent positions and titles approved by the School Awards Committee in the National or International level competitions for three consecutive years and who have already received a Co-Scholastic Tie the previous year.
- 2. Awarded on achieving First three positions in National level of External Examinations for three consecutive years and who have already received Co-scholastic Tie the previous year.
- 3. Awarded on achieving top ten Final International positions in External Examinations for three consecutive years and who have already received Co-scholastic Tie the previous year.

Citation

- 1. Awarded to the First three positions or any other equivalent positions and titles approved by the School Awards Committee in National or International level competitions for four consecutive years and who have already received Piped Co-Scholastic Blazer the previous year.
- 2. Awarded on achieving First three positions in National level of External Examinations for 4 consecutive years and who have already received Piped Co-scholastic Blazer the previous year.
- 3. Awarded on achieving top ten Final International ranks in External Examinations for 4 consecutive years and who have already received Piped Co-scholastic Blazer.

Principal's Trophy (Running Trophy): All Round Best House- Awarded to the House for achieving maximum points in various Inter-House Competitions conducted during the session.

NOTE:

- (i) Students who have left the school are not considered for the award.
- (ii) Candidature for awards may be cancelled on disciplinary grounds.
- (iii) The External Exams considered for the School Awards are: SOF, Silver Zone, IAPT, Unified Council, Conquest Olympiad, IRO and BSE.
- (iv) Events organized by CBSE, DPS Society, SAI, Khelo India, National Badminton Championship organised under the aegis of Badmintion Association of India and SGFI in Sports, Music, Dance, Art & Craft, Science & Innovation, Robotics and Literary activities are only eligible for the above-mentioned awards.

ACTIVITIES AT SCHOOL

The school curriculum leads to sound academic growth. However, involvement in cocurricular activities is an essential part of schooling.

Some of the activities which the school provides are:

- 1. Games and Sports: Football, Cricket, Badminton, Indoor Games etc.
- 2. Art and Craft: Drawing, Painting, Craftwork and creating Best out of Waste.
- 3. **Music**: Instrumental and Vocal.
- 4. **Computer:** Multimedia Presentations, Graphics Designing, Desktop Publishing (DTP), Computer Hardware, Maintenance and Troubleshooting, Programming, Internet, Web Designing, Online Projects etc.
- 5. **Ecology / Environment Studies**: Seminars, Projects, Exhibitions, Quizzes, Demonstrations, Symposium etc.
- 6. **Reading Scheme Activities**: Students are exposed to words, sentences, stories asper their level, so that they enjoy hearing, repeating, understanding and demonstrating.
- 7. **Language Enrichment Programme (LEP)**: Providing opportunity for students to master the language through constant exposure to audio and audio-visual inputs to build expression and vocabulary using dialogues and discussions.
- 8. **Audio Visual Learning Supplement**: Learning by doing is the call of the day, especially for the junior classes. The school enriches the curriculum with AV aids to ensure better understanding and retention.
- 9. **Students Counselling**: School caters to counselling and guidance of students in developing their personality and shaping career.
- 10. **Mental Maths and General Awareness:** Tests are conducted to enhance Mental Mathematical Aptitude and General Awareness.
- 11. **Yoga and Diya Meditation**: Great emphasis is given to Yoga and Diya Meditation to bolster up the power of concentration, accentuate memory power and balance Physical / Mental aspect.
- 12. **Personality Development Clubs:** Various clubs like Spoken English, Calligraphy, Eco-club, Debate Club, Synergy Club, Art & Craft, Fireless Cooking Club, Sports Club, Dance and Music (Vocal and Instrumental) are organized for holistic development of the children and tapping their inherent talent in the fields of their interest.

- 13. **Cultural Assemblies** provide an opportunity for students to develop community spirit and reinforce positive reflective ethos and promote value-based education.
- 14. **Special Day Celebrations**: International Yoga Day, National Mathematics Day, Hindi Diwas, Energy Conservation Day etc., are celebrated with zeal to create awareness and consciousness.
- 15. **Art Integrated Learning** activities as suggested by CBSE are conducted to interlink education and culture.

ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

Assessment is an integral part of the learning process as it gauges the consistent progress made by the child throughout the academic session.

PRE-PRIMARY CLASSES

- Promotion to the next class is based on continuous assessment i.e. child's daily performance, quality of the work, assimilation of the concepts taught, participation in class and co-curricular activities.
- Skills in different areas will be assessed and graded on a 5-point scale.

CLASSES I-V

- Skills in different areas will be assessed and graded on a 5-point scale.
- Academic session will be divided into two terms. In each term assessment of 70 marks in each subject will be conducted as follows:

Terminal Examination - 50 marks
 Periodic Written Test - 10 marks
 Subject Enrichment Activity - 5 marks
 Notebook Submission - 5 marks

CLASSES VI-VIII

- The academic session will be divided into two terms and will be assessed out of 100 marks in each term.
- In each term, in each subject, there will be an end-of-term written examination for 80 marks and Periodic Assessment for 20 marks.
- Periodic Assessment will consist of three components as follows:
 - 10 marks for Unit Test (Written)
 - 5 marks for Subject Enrichment Activity
 - 5 marks for Notebook Submission Regularity, Assignment Completion, Neatness & Upkeep of notebook

Results of students will be withheld under the following conditions:

- (a) Non clearance of fees till 15th March of the financial year.
- (b) Attendance below 75%.
